HOGS WEAKER AND PRICES SHOW LOSS

LOSS OF 10c MARKED DURING DAY'S SALES

Sales Are Not So Easily Made and Selected Quality Brings as High as \$10.55 and as Low as \$10.45.

Portland Union Stockyards, Stockdale, May 20.—The market for hogs is showing a tinge of weakness that really means a loss of 10c in price.

Small supplies were shown in the yards this morning but this was a very good feature. Some cattle were carried over from yesterday because of the lack of buyers.

Again it should be stated here that there is but little call for unfinished cattle in the yards at this time because of the importation of grass finished stock from California.

California Stuff Moves First. This is the time of the year when California stuff has the lead in the livestock market because the grass stock is in better condition than can be turned out by local people at so early a date.

Market for calves is showing a slight decline from the high point but this can be expected at this period because local values have been held up to a very high basis.

Sheep market showing no change, being very dull with quotations practically as previously announced. No arrivals of sheep or lambs were shown in the yards today.

Among the Shippers. J. W. Chandler had a load of hogs from Union, Ore., on today's market. McKinnon & Chandler shipped a mixed load of cattle and hogs for today's trade.

Kidwell & Caswell were represented in today's yard transactions by a load of hogs from North Powder. W. H. Fields sent forward two loads of hogs from Idaho Falls, Idaho.

O. M. Lister shipped three loads of cattle from The Dalles. Today's run of livestock compares with this day in recent years as follows:
