Portland Union Stockyards, North Portland, Ore., May 26.-Sheep mar-ket showed a steadier feeling today and values were quite well maintained There was only a small run of sheep in the yards today and this, following the small run yesterday and the lack of arrivals for the rest of the week, caused the improved tone.

While killers retain quite liberal supplies of sheep, they are not averse to buying and paying the present market, providing shipments do not come so fast that everyone will be overstocked.

Bight loads of cattle came in from California this morning and found a good demand around former figures. Nebraska shipped eight loads of

hogs into the local territory today, the shipment being direct to the Union Meat company, and therefore did not enter the market.




