Pertland, Or., June 3 .- While there was only a moderate run of livestock during the past 24 hours, more lines are showing an inclination to turn turtle. The weakness is most intent in hog transactions, although during the past 24 hours \$10.15 was obtained for one lot of extra select quality. This sale was made, too, in the face of the general apinion of the trade that nothing over \$10 was obtainable. However, most transactions were at the lower figure.

Sheep market prices are holding intact with \$6 still obtainable for fancy lambs. Sales at this price are again reported officially by sellers. Weakness is again apparent in the

cattle market. Lower prices in California have caused a similar notion to enter the heads of buyers here, and all are now clamoring for cheaper stuff, but better quality.
