LOCAL CATTLE IN PORTLAND MARKET

STEADY RUN OF GRASS STOCK IS NOW ON

Some Light Stuff Is Pushed on Market Because of High Prices Obtainable for Selected Quality in Yards.

Portland Union Stockyards, June 8.—There was a continuation of yesterday's firmness in the cattle market here, and values were safely maintained.

Run of cattle during the day was fair and this, in addition to the more liberal supply of yesterday, was quickly taken up by the buyers.

Demand for all livestock is showing better form, but the principal strength naturally is in sheep and cattle.

Local Cattle Are Coming. Local grass cattle movement has started in earnest and while the quality of arrivals to date has been such that shippers would have received more money had they kept them home for a while...

While fancy cattle are scarce and prices are quoted high, the poor and light stuff is not bringing more in proportion than it would with the market normal.

WINTER WHEAT AT 80; SPRING WHEAT AT 92.8

Chicago Market Opens Low But Closes at High Point.

Government Crop Report. 1910, 1909, 1908, 1907. Winter wheat... 89.7 86.0 77.4

Chicago, June 8.—Wheat started weak and lower under press of heavier cables. In all options the low point for the day was reached at the opening...

When Liverpool came 3-8d at the opening and 7-3d at the closing there was an inducement to sell additional shorts.

The easier cash wheat situation at home was responsible in a measure for some of the weakness displayed at the opening for options.

Paris closed unchanged to 10 centimes lower for wheat and unchanged to 10 centimes higher for flour.

The Michigan state grain report for June shows the condition of winter wheat at 87 per cent, compared with 86 per cent last month and 82 per cent a year ago.

Today's government report on wheat gives the total condition of the spring and winter varieties at 81 per cent. The area of spring wheat reaches 19,742,000 acres.
