Drop of About 10 to 15c Shown in Both That Line and Sheep at North Portland—Run is Quite Good.

Portland Union Stockyards, North Portland, Ore., June 23.—A weaker feeling is shown in cattle and sheep, but hogs are firmer with an inclination to advance.

There was a fairly good run of hogs and calves today and a continuance of the good run of sheep. Some of the poor quality cattle held over from the first of the week, are still unsold in the yards.

Sheep market shows a loss of about 10c to 20c from recent sales and buyers are taking hold very sparingly.
