SHEEP ARE WEAK IN PORTLAND YARDS

FANCY LAMBS SELL FOR \$5.95 YESTERDAY

All Poor Cattle Cleaned Up at Liberal Prices, Considering State of Market and Unsatisfactory Quality.

Portland Union Stockyards, North Portland, June 23.—Heavy arrivals and an oversupply already on hand, is hurting trade in the market for sheep and lambs, and some select lambs sold at \$5.95 today.

Run of sheep and lambs during the 24 hours was 800 head, compared with 1933 yesterday and 1246 head a week ago.

All buyers are inclined to be bearish regarding the sheep and lamb situation although the present market is quite low enough, according to general conditions.

Hogs are showing steadiness, although it is apparent that any heavy run here would cause packers to hoist the signal of distress and pull down quotations. Weakness in the east recently is having some effect and the big people are not now buying here. The run is so small that, even the smallest of the killers are able to take care of it.

Cattle market has been cleaned up of the recent heavy load, and while the prices were not in the main satisfactory to all concerned, still, considering the quality of shipments and the oversupply of this grade offering, receivers achieved wonders in getting from under. A small supply of half fat or wholly starved cattle will go a long way in supplying the wants of the trade of the Pacific northwest for this particular quality.

CHICAGO RESPONDS TO DAMAGE NOTES

Wheat Market Closes 1 5-8 to 1 7-8c a Bushel Higher Than Wednesday.

Chicago, June 23.—Wheat advanced sharply during the session. Closing was 1 5-8 to 1 7-8c a bushel higher than yesterday.

Rains that fell in the wheat belts were disappointing, because of the very small precipitation. Some of the chief growing districts have had no relief at all, according to this morning's reports.

Weakness at the opening of the Liverpool market was very marked, initial values being at a decline of 1 5-8d to 1 3-4d. Closing was after some improvement and last figures were 3-8d to 1-2d under yesterday.
