Lord Strathcona Now in His 90th Year.

London,-Lord Strathcona Mount Royal, who has received an honorary D. C. L. from Durham university, has been Canada's high commissioner since 1896. The following HIS EYE LAID OPEN | year he received his peerage. He is in his 90th year, and, not without reason, has been called the Grand Old Man of Canada,

Born in Scotland in poor circumstances, he is yet another example of northern enterprise. His first voyage across the Atlantic took 36 days and his memories go back to the flourishing times of the Hudson Bay company, whose service he entered when wouth.

Lord Strathcona is an ardent Imperialist, and has done as much as to establish and maintain the affection existing between Canada and the mother country. During the South African war he raised own expense, Strathcona's horse, a large body or mounted troops which did excellent service at the

Strathcona in an official statement on the subject of emigration to Canada, says that many erconeous statements have recently appeared respecting the restrictions which the government of Canada have oundd it necessary to impose.

The Canadian authorities are greatly desirous of strengthening the Britsh element in Canada. All are encouraged to emigrate who are able and willing to work. It is obvious, however, that proper care must be taken to ensure, as far as possible. that no people who are unfit shall go out and be stranded. There is employment for all in Canada who are fit and willing to work and who can comply with prevailing regulations.


