BREAK ALL RECORDS

SELL AT \$6 WHICH
RAISES TOP NOTCH

One Lot Goes at the High Mark at
North Portland; Few Cattle Come
and Situation is Very Firm.

Portland Union Stockyards, North
Portland, Or., July 13.—Lambs sold
up to \$6 today and thereby broke all
previous records for this time of the
year.

There was only a small showing of
supplies today—a handful of cattle,
a small run of hogs and a very mod-
erate supply of sheep and lambs.

Trade conditions all through the
livestock market are showing not only
a continuation of the previous good
character but in most lines there is a
strengthening of values.

Hogs are holding extremely firm
with a number of sales of good stock
at \$10.25, the recent high mark.

So few cattle came forward today
that the price could scarcely be com-
pared with previous ones.

and sheep from that point today.

Carlton with a mixed load of hogs and
sheep.

E. S. Brown shipped two loads of
sheep from Corvallis and was the only
shipper of the day who did not have
mixed stuff.
