FEW ARRIVALS IN YARDS WITH EXCEPTION OF SHEEP

Trading Is Slow-Good Demand for Lambs-Few Hogs Arrive-Cattle Market Not Overfirm,

A large per cent of these are of poor quality and therefore shipments of extra select quality find quick response from buyers. 
