

PROPS ARE KNOCKED FROM UNDER CATTLE

POOR QUALITY CAUSES SLUMP IN MARKET

Buyers Bid 25c Less for Off-Grade Stuff in Order to Discourage Shipments—Hogs Sell Up to \$10.25.

Portland Union Stockyards, North Portland, Or., July 18.—Cattle were weaker today because of the greater supply of poor quality offering. Only a small amount of good stuff came forward, but this received good attention from buyers and values remained about as previously quoted.

Packers cut the price of poor stuff about 25c because they wanted to discourage the shipment of this class of stock.

Hogs remained about as previously quoted and sales were made as high as \$10.25 for select quality.

DEFERRED OPTIONS CLOSE WITH A LOSS

September and December Are Under Saturday Opening Up—July Higher.

Chicago, July 18.—Considering the sharp advance abroad and the early advance, the closing loss of 1-4c to 1-8c for September and December wheat options, respectively, was a surprise. July closed 1-2c higher than Saturday.

Opening values here were 1-2c to 3-4c a bushel higher than the closing of the sharp advance abroad and continuation of poor crop reports.

Liverpool started 7-8d to 1d advanced but closed 2d to 2 1-8d above Saturday.

Broomhall cabled: "World's shipments: Wheat, 6,464,000 bushels; corn, 4,383,000 bushels. Wheat on passage decreased 2,110,000 bushels. Russian wheat shipments, 3,192,000 bushels; Danuban, 384,000 bushels."

Berlin.—The male inhabitants of Heligoland are now liable to military service. The proposition to make male inhabitants attaining the age of manhood liable to conscription for army service was suggested to follow the twentieth anniversary of the ending of Heligoland, which occurred during the first week of the present month. In addition to becoming liable to military service the inhabitants must assume Prussian taxes and they also come under the operation of the German customs tariff.
