TO FIGHT LA FOLLETTE BY SAME MEANS HE WAS ELECTED

Milwaukee, Wis.-The Wisconsin Taft republicans, organized at the restate convention in Milwaukee to fight the spread of La Folletteism and if possible to defeat the progressive leader for re-election, will use the same fighting, machine-like organization that characterized the election of La Follette to his first term as governor, which later was used to elect a candidate for governor of the progressive type, but which now will be used against the man in

whose interest it was first formed. The man who advised the system and who worked it successly in two campaigns for La Follette, W. D. Connor, is the man who is now organizing the old-styte fighting machine for use against La Follette,

The officers are already developing the new machine, which will consist almost entirely of republican clubs. The Connor plan is to form clubs in every precinct in the state. The clubs then work through the individuals, each individual learning and reporting to headquarters the sentiments of his neighbors.

Through this organization it is possible to make a card index of every voter in Wisconsin. The card index system was used to etect La Follette, and now it is used to defeat him.

Tobacco Prices Are Raised. Washington.-The internal revenue tax on smoking and chewing tobacco, cigars and cigarettes imposed by the Payne-Aldrich tariff law has become effective. The tax on smoking and chewing tobacco is increased from

six to eight cents a pound The increase on small weighing not more than three pounds a thousand is from 54 to 75 cents a thousand. A like increase is effective on cigarettes weighing not more than three pounds a thousand. The

tax on large cigarettes is also raised. The consumer is compelled to pay the increased cost. The tobacco trust and some of the independents have already raised prices or reduced the sizes of their goods.
