

Everybody aboard knew she was not a boy but none suspected she was Mme Leneve. After her arrest she was given a loose gown and led down the gang plank, but fainted when she reached the prison. Inspector Dew expressed the belief the woman was not a participant in the alleged murder. According to British law, suspects may not be questioned except perfunctorily regarding the crime which they are accused and they are warned that anything they may say will be used against them. 
