

GOOD QUALITY COWS FIRM AND STEADY

PRICE STILL REMAINS
AT \$4.65 IN YARDS

Cattle Market Is Good With Few Arrivals; Sheep and Lambs Are Firm With No Run in the Yards.

Portland Union Stockyards, North Portland Or., Aug. 2.—Two loads of cattle and one load of calves was the total offering this morning in the livestock market. There was a good tone in calves and sales were made up to the \$6.75 for stuff that went around 200 pounds.

Steers were offering around \$5.50 but on the basis of this best quality would have been worth at least \$5.75.

In reporting the sale of wethers yesterday the price should have been \$4.35 instead of \$4.25, as printed. The market for sheep and lambs is firm. No arrivals were shown in that line this morning for the open market.

Hog market is nominal, with no arrivals, and therefore no price changes.

THE WHEAT MARKET
WHEAT IS HEAVY AND LOSSES ARE HEAVY
Chicago Drops Severely After a Bad Dip in Liverpool Quotations Yesterday.
Chicago, Aug. 2.—Wheat market closed heavy with losses of 1c to 1 7/8c a bushel with September options the weakest delivery.
A sharp lower opening here was influenced by the drop at Liverpool and the market never recovered in the slightest, particular the weakness displayed at the start.
Liverpool cables were extremely bearish. At the opening there was a loss of 1 1/4d to 1d while the closing was 2 5/8d under yesterday.
There were no new developments in the crop situation and this left the bears in absolute control of the market.

IRISH POTATO CROP MAY BE FAILURE
Dublin, Ireland.—A grave crisis faces Ireland! Oppression is forgotten temporarily, landlordism is but an unpleasant memory! The truth is that, all along the western seaboard from Belmullet to Killeries, and as far inland as Crossmoline and Castlebar, blight weather has ruined the potato crop.
Unless climatic conditions change quickly the outlook for the season's crop of potatoes is extremely grave. The heavy and continued rains, accompanied by high winds, have beaten on the vines and dried. In some of the low lying districts potato fields are completely submerged. The greatest anxiety prevails for the hay and oat crops. Fruit has also suffered extensively.
