Attempt to Wreck Train Fails. Spokane, Wash.—Great Northern train No. 44, Seattle to Kansas City was wrecked by dynamite one mile west of Nippon, Wash., near the summit of the Cascades, early Friday.

North Yakima has Big Blaze. North Yakima, Wash.—Fire thought to have been caused by a gas explosion burned the building and stock of the Yakima Grocery company, a wholesale house, at 2 o'clock Friday morning, causing a loss of \$120,000.

Bullet Inflicts Serious Wound. Astoria, Ore.—A man named James Jamieson of Portland, was brought to the city Friday morning and taken to the hospital suffering with a gunshot wound in the left breast near the heart.
