WILLIAM FRAZIER CALLED BY DEATH

WELL KNOWN PIONEER OF COUNTY PASSES AWAY

Dies at Old Home After Long Illness—Has Been Resident of County Since 1879—Is Survived by Wife and Eight Children.

William Frazier, aged 81 years and a resident of Umatilla county for 31 years, died at 2 o'clock this morning at his home on West Railroad street after an illness of 18 months. During a great part of this time his suffering was intense. A year ago in May he suffered a stroke of paralysis and since that time he had been an invalid, able only to be about the house. a disposition to do so, the church would do anything in its power to make surrender easy—to save the state's face.

But when it actually comes to the point of making up its mind whether to fight or to surrender any part of its power and privilege the church will fight. It is already preparing to fight. Its wealth, its influence and its intelligence are enormous and its preparations are ominously thorough.

On the state's side will be the king, the cabinet, the whole of the liberal and official forces, the powerful republican organizations and the socialists; on the church's side the episcopate and clergy, the entire conservative party, the aristocracy, all the ignorant classes and practically all the women of the country.

The Alternative.
The church's aim, if the worst comes, will be to depose Alfonso and to enthronize the Carlist pretender, Don Jaime. So long as he remained faithful to the clericals, the clericals remained faithful to Alfonso, and Jaime stood no chance. If the clericals declare for him, however, he will instantly become formidable. The clericals have not done so yet, for they are not even yet quite sure that Alfonso will not return to them. But they will do it the moment they become positively convinced they have lost him. Carlist agents are already busy in the country in anticipation of a clerical declaration in favor of their chief. Jaime has stated that he will not interfere in Spain unless it becomes necessary for him to maintain or restore order. The clericals will see, in due season that he is furnished with the excuse he says he wants.

How a fight between Alfonso and Jaime would result—admitting the latter to be supported by the clericals nobody knows. It rather looks as if Alfonso would win but the clericals are tremendously strong.

Alfonso in Jeopardy.
Assuming that Jaime and the clericals lose, it is still no foregone conclusion that Alfonso, individually, will win. The vatican believes the present agitation in Spain and Portugal is not only anti-clerical but that the agitators propose a union of the two countries under a president.

Whether this is true or not, there is no doubt that the Spanish radicals question the possibility of permanently maintaining satisfactory conditions under a monarchy. Alfonso happens, for the moment, to be on their side, but they distrust him and would assuredly take advantage of any good opportunity they might see to throw him overboard in the confusion of a civil war.

Alfonso's change from the clericals to the anti-clericals has changed the situation somewhat since last summer. The issue was clear cut then between Alfonso and the clericals on one side and the anti-clericals and republicans upon the other. Alfonso has allied himself now with the group which apparently ought to win in the end. But whether victory for his group will make for greater security of his own tenure is more doubtful. Alfonso is in a dangerous place.

Genoa, Italy, Aug. 20.—A distinguished party of Catholic pilgrims, traveling under the auspices of the Knights of Columbus of America, will reach here tomorrow to pay a visit to the birthplace of Columbus. Later the Americans will go to Rome, where they will be received in special audience by Pope Pius X.

To Swim Hell Gate.
New York, Aug. 20.—The sixth annual Hell Gate swim, under the auspices of the United States Volunteer Life Saving Corps, is scheduled for tomorrow. Many life savers will take part in the attempt to negotiate the dangerous course.

Pennsylvania Bible Conference.
