King Alfonso and Premier Canalejas would unquestionably like to back out of their program if they could, Failing that, they would like to delay as long as possible. They cannot back out because they believe they would precipitate a revolution by doing so. They cannot delay too long or the anti-clericals will become suspicious of them and the ever-im-minent revolution will start. There is that much reason for thinking that the climax will come soon. Still, it is certain that the king and premier will move as slowly as they dare.
