FREEWATER-MILTON NOT ONLY FRUIT DISTRICT

Growers Along Umatilla River and in

Pilot Rock Section Have Many Carloads to Ship.

While other sections of Umatilla county, considering themselves the real fruit districts have been boastng of their phenomenal crops and sending out hurry calls for help in the harvest of big red apples and yellow pears, the fruit crop in the immediate vicinity of Pendleton and along the Umatilla river, has been lost sight of It is a fact, however, that

It is estimated that there are six carloads of apples on the Oliver farm alone, while nearly every ranch along the river between this city and Yoakum contains from a half to three car loads of this fruit.
