

INDIAN SCALPED.

Firewater Puts Redskin Under Wheels of Train.

Succumbing to the red man's temp-tation, "firewater," Jim Moody, a Warm Springs Indian, was killed suitable for their purpose, dairying. early yesterday morning by a Southern Pacific train north of Brooks.
