**Caldwell Will Ship Apples.**  
Caldwell, Idaho.—E. B. Field, manager of the Caldwell Fruit Growers' association, states that there will be approximately 27,000 boxes of apples shipped from Caldwell this season. Figuring 600 boxes to the car, this would mean the shipment from here of 45 cars of apples.  
The largest bearing apple orchard in the Caldwell vicinity is 20 acres and belongs to W. A. George, whose splendid ranch is located in Caldwell's famous orchard district.  
It is estimated that 2000 acres in the this spring. This is an immense planting and indicates the large fruit business being developed here.  
Nine cars of prunes have so far been shipped through this association. Many more are yet to be shipped.

## INDICTED CRIMINALS DRAW SENTENCES

### ONE GOES TO PEN THREE OUT ON PAROLE

#### William Evans Draws Two Years at Salem—Others Fare More Fortunately.

Six recently indicted and self-confessed criminals appeared before the bar of justice this morning. One drew a two year sentence in the penitentiary, while the other five were more successful, each of them either having been favored with a parole or a suspended sentence.  
William Evans, one of the trio who stole a quantity of elk teeth and other things from some Indians, was sentenced to serve two years in the penitentiary.  
Leslie Butler, one of Evans' companions, was favored with a suspension of sentence during good behavior, while Thomas Balcom, the other companion, was sentenced and paroled.  
Clarence Ogilvy, the Pilot Rock youthful horse thief, was treated to a

suspension of sentence during good behavior.

J. H. Maxwell, the Meacham bartender who was indicted on a charge assault and battery, was paroled.

Theodore Cramer, one of the Coe near beer men indicted for violation of the local option law, was arraigned and his bonds fixed at \$200. He has not yet been able to raise the money and is still in jail.

## MANY "OUTLAWS" HERE FOR ROUND-UP

Everything is now in readiness for the Roundup and from present indications the capacity of the city, as well as of the grounds, will be taxed to their utmost. All the plans of the committee have worked out so successfully that it seems that nothing comissary and the entire exhibition will be far in excess of all expectations.

Two more riders were thrown yesterday afternoon in the practice conducted at the grounds, much to the amusement of the throng which had gathered. In accordance with a recent ruling of the committee, however, no more spectators will be allowed at the grounds until the opening of the Roundup Thursday.

Seal brothers arrived yesterday evening from Morrow county with a string of experienced outlaws. Every one of these horses is a tried out bucker and will not need any practice before hand. New horses are being brought in daily, however, and these will all be tried out and the poor ones eliminated before the Roundup opens. No horse will be saddled that has not demonstrated on more than one occasion that he is bucker and a hard one.

"Dynamite Will Be Saddled." "Dynamite," considered by his owner Warren C. Gibbs, the worst bucking horse in the northwest, will be saddled this evening in the Power, harness booth at the district fair. The special order \$175 saddle will be placed on his back in the presence of the crowd. Dynamite was given a brief tryout on the grounds Saturday evening, having little difficulty in disposing of Jim Whitebull, the Indian bronco buster.

Secretary James Gwinn announced this afternoon that the Masonic hall would be open as a rest room during the Roundup and that it would be in charge of the ladies of the Eastern Star. The Odd Fellows hall will also be open as a rest room to any and everyone during the show. These were secured for the reason that it was feared the public rest room in the city hall would not be large enough to accommodate the throngs.
