

YEARLING WETHERS SELL AT HIGH PRICE

ONE SALE IS MADE
AT SIX DOLLARS

One Lot of Extra Select Stuff from Medford Brings Far Above Any Figure Previously Reached on the Present Move.

Portland, Ore., Oct. 26.—One sale of some extra fancy yearling wethers was made in the stockyards this morning at \$6 per hundred pounds. The price secured was starting in view of values heretofore ruled in the North Portland markets. For years this has been known as a very poor sheep and lamb market, but recently conditions have changed and today Portland is taking its place with the best of them.

The yearlings that sold this morning came from Medford and were shipped by H. G. Wirtman. They averaged 90 pounds and are said by experts to be the best wethers ever offered in this market.

Along with the yearlings were shipped a number of sheep and lambs but these had not been sold this morning owing to a difference of opinion regarding the price.

During the past 24 hours 9 loads of hogs came in from Nebraska. These can now be landed in the Pacific northwest packing houses at \$9.80, and as they are better than recent local offerings, packers seem inclined to continue their purchases in the Omaha territory.

Cattle market is showing practically no change in receipts during the 24 hours, consisting principally of calves.

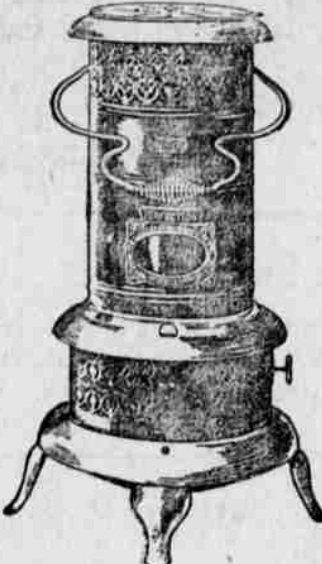

DECEMBER SHORTS
COVER THEIR MARKET

Chicago Wheat Market Closes 3-8 to 1-1-8c a Bushel Higher Than Tuesday.

Chicago, Oct. 26.—Weakness abroad failed to check the covering of shorts in the wheat market here and the closing was 3-8 to 1-1-8c higher.

Heavy purchases of December wheat by leading interests usually on the bear side, gave the bulls their clue today and intense buying resulted in the sharp advance. The market opened 1-8c higher for December and May but July was unchanged. Foreign markets were weaker and generally lower.
