This will be the most important meeting of the kind ever held on the coast and the members of the council were of the opinion that the knowledge gained from having a representative at the meeting would enable them to save to the city many times the cost of sending a delegate. In addition to many important questions relative to city administration which will be discussed there will be an expostion of municipal machinery and supplies. The economical administration of city affairs will be the keynote of the convention.




