than when liquor was lower. Thus, instead of making anything on the tax, the liberals are confronted with a big loss of revenue. It is evident that a "limit of taxation" has een reached, and further increase only drives down consumption.

It has also driven down actual production, for the report shows that the amount of whisky distilled in Ireand has fallen off 12 per cent. The resent semi-annual meetings of stockholders in the various whisky firms all faced big drops in dividends, so there appears to be a general loss all round. But the liberals stoutly maintain that the effective boom to temperance is not to be ignored.

For a decreased consumption of whisky, while it may cut in on the frequently cited "widows and orphans" who have their money in whisky distilleries, registers mechancally, nevertheless, on the credit side of the nation's balance sheet. Apart from the improved moral stamina therefrom derived, there are statistics of decrease in crime, petty disorder and drunkenness, a big drop in infant mortality rates and a general uplift of the standard of national health all around. To all these results the dereased consumption of whisky counts inevitably as a contributing cause, and any tampering with the liquor taxes will be opposed by hardy arguments based on these achievements.
