WARRINGTON WILL STAY AT PILOT ROCK

Rev. E. W. Warrington is to remain as pastor of the Presbyterian church at Pilot Rock. This announcement was made here last evening by Rev. J. M. Cornelson, chairman of the committee of home missions of the Pendleton presbytery, following his return from a visit to Pilot Rock.

Cornelson had gone to Pilot Rock Saturday morning for the purpose of making arrangements for the transfer of Mr. Warrington to Bend, Oregon, where the committee believed he could accomplish more for the church.

When he arrived at the Rock, however, he was fairly swamped with petitions, signed by people all the way from Pilot Rock to Camas prairie and beseeching the committee to allow the pastor to remain where he is.

The case was discussed by those most insistent on retaining Warrington on the one hand and by the chairman of the mission committee on the other, at great length. The result was that the chairman announced last evening that the pastor would be allowed to remain and that an effort would be made to find some one else for the Bend field.

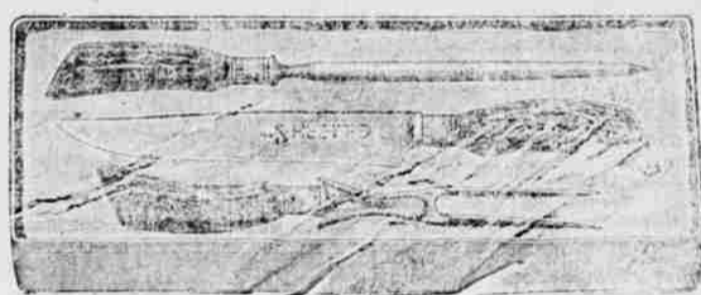
GIRL WEEPS 5 DAYS; WEDDING POSTPONED
