### JURY HEARS WEIRD TALES.

University Graduate Is on Trial for Insanity.  
 Milwaukee, Wis.—Anton Ehrnbeck, a graduate of the University of Wisconsin and formerly employed in the city's engineering department and who refused to become an inmate of the asylum at Patton without a jury trial, although he had been committed there by the lunacy commission, was given an opportunity in department nine of the superior court to tell his case to a jury.

Ehrnbeck, who resides with his mother and sisters at 1132 Trenton street, is thirty-one years old. He was charged with insanity by his mother, who said he had threatened her and his sisters with a gun and declared his intention to commit suicide. She thinks he suffers from delusions and thinks everybody is trying to persecute him. On the stand yesterday she would not swear that her son is insane, but she declared he was not the same man he had been six months before.

Ehrnbeck was placed on the stand to tell his story and related alleged weird incidents in a private sanitarium where he had been placed for a while. He asserted he had been strapped to a bed and given hypodermic injections of some drug to quiet him. Then, he said, to the uncanny accompaniment of the howls of persons hopelessly insane, the nurses engaged in an imitation ghost dance about his room.

The family, including a brother, Lieutenant Arthur P. Ehrnbeck, a graduate of West point, who is in the engineering corps of the United States army, being located at Vancouver barracks, and who came here for the trial, wants him placed somewhere that he can be cured of his alleged mental disease. They say that his father died about a year ago, leaving an estate of \$25,000, their interest in which the children deeded to the mother. She wants to devote any part of it necessary for the benefit of her son.

### To Hunt for Rare Birds.

London.—A final attempt is being made by the New Zealand government to obtain specimens of the hula, a bird which has been practically exterminated by the vogue for its feathers which which obtains among the Maoris.  
 The hula is a jet-black bird with a white band at the extreme end of its tail feathers. The male has a short strong beak, and the female a long, slender, incurved beak; the male breaks the bark off dead trees and the female then dips her beak into the holes of the big grubs which attack dead timber. She presents one grub to her mate and then has one herself, alternating most conscientiously.

### Old Cannon Balls Found.

London.—Two more stone cannon balls from the sunken Armada ship in Torbay may have been brought to the surface by divers. The sand has now been cleared by the suction pump off the huge mound containing the Armada galleon and a lane has been bored through the dense mass of shells thus disclosed. After this heavy task had been accomplished there was next discovered a substantial bed of stones. It is thought that both the shells and the stones, some of the latter weighing half a ton, formed the ballast of the Florence, for the shells are unlike anything in the vicinity.

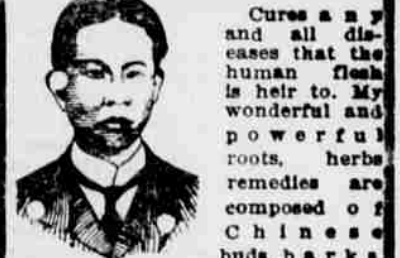
