STUDENTS TO MAKE MERRY IN GYMNASIUM TONIGHT

Wrestling and Boxing Bouts Will Inter-mingle With Basketball to Provide Entertainment for Students, Parents and Friends.

Pendleton high school will inaugurate the winter athletic season this evening in the high school gymnasium with a big athletic carnival such as was put on last year at different times with such great success. The main attraction of the evening will be a basketball game between the ball tossers of the Senior and Sophomore classes and those of the Junior and Freshman contingent. Great rivalry exists between these two factions, and as the contest will serve as a tryout for the selection of the five men who will appear on the floor to uphold the honors of the school this year, it will be all the more exciting.

Aside from the basketball game there will be other athletic features, prominent among which will be the boxing and wrestling matches. Young Milne is pitted against the veteran Snyder in a three round go for the heavyweight championship, while Sturdivant and McDonald will enter the ring for like honors in the middleweight class. McCoy and Dorsey will spar for lightweight crown.

In the wrestling contest, Carroll and Ford are scheduled for a bout, best two out of three falls. Stangler and Pinnell will also lock horns for supremacy.

The line-up in the basketball game will be as follows: Senior-Sophomore: C. Jordan, center; A. Jordan and Devine, guards; Boylen and Kimball, forwards. Junior-Freshman. Houser, center; Fee and Hampton, guards; Chapman and Strain forwards.

The carnival is scheduled to open at 8 o'clock.

RABIES AFFECT WALLOWA COYOTES

ANIMAL WHICH BIT BOY PROVEN TO HAVE BEEN MAD

Investigations Started by State Veterinarian Lytle Demonstrate That Original Suspicions Were Correct—Sheep and Pigs Bitten and Infected.

It has been conclusively proven that the coyote which some time ago ran amuck in Wallowa county and bit several sheep, a pig and a small boy, was affected with the rabies. At that time Dr. W. H. Lytle of this city, state veterinarian, made a trip to Wallowa to investigate the case but as unable to make a direct examination. However, he took the precaution of sending the little boy to Portland, where he could be given the Pasteur treatment, and he also sent the heads of the pig and one of the sheep which had been bitten to the state bacteriologist for an examination.

The announcement of the findings of that specialist was made in the following story by the Portland Journal last evening:

Germs of rabies have been found by Professor Pernot, state bacteriologist, in heads of sheep and a pig bitten by a coyote in Wallowa county. The same coyote bit John Bosley, a boy, who is being given Pasteur treatment by Dr. White and Professor Pernot, in order that any tendency to hydrophobia may be checked.

Professor Pernot's discoveries give foundation to the numerous reports that rabies or hydrophobia is epidemic among coyotes in eastern Oregon. With Negri bodies, germs of hydrophobia, Professor Pernot yesterday injected rabbits. One of the rabbits was dead this morning. The other will be expected to develop rabies in about two weeks, and if it does, will be taken as conclusive proof by Pernot that "mad coyotes" of eastern Oregon are really afflicted with rabies. The heads of bitten animals were brought to Portland by the state veterinarian, Dr. W. H. Lytle.

Professor Pernot is anxious that the results of tests which he made upon the heads of bitten animals shall not be the cause of general alarm till the results of the injections in the rabbits are obtained.

The parents of the Bosley boy have come to Portland, to be with him until it is proven whether or not he will develop rabies from the coyote's bite. His face is badly scarred where the coyote bit him.
