DEATH BLOW DEALT PENNSYLVANIA TRUST

Philadelphia, Penn., Dec. 20.—The United States court of appeals, it is believed, virtually dealt a death blow to Pennsylvania's anthracite coal trust today when it practically dissolved the Temple Iron company through which it is said the coterie of coal barons worked. The court decreed that the railroads and other corporations interested in the company will not be permitted to vote their Temple stock. The decision is expected to put the company out of business.

For a long time it is said, the Temple company has been the medium through which several affiliated corporations have secured for distribution all the products of Pennsylvania's coal mines. This gave them a chance to dictate prices and otherwise control the market, it is alleged.
