Except that lying above the feed canal this tract can be supplied with water until about July 1 from the feed canal and it is proposed to develop power at the A-C drop to be used in pumping water from 10 to 40 feet for the remaining months. The pumping system may also include the saving of waste water now in the seepage lake region on the present project. This scheme appears feasible and has been discussed here nearly a year. In addition to this land a strip lies on the north side of the project that can be brought under water by a pipe line and 1000 acres in the vicinity of Cold Springs station on the Columbia can be easily covered partly by drainage water and by water from the big reservoir.
