The feeling in bluestem is improved all around. California millers are bidding up to 86c a bushel track, but buyers say they are finding little for sale even at this price. Some buyers who were formerly holding bluestem no higher than 84c are today quoting 85c.

Still another advance of 5c a ton is quoted for brewing barley at interior points. As high as \$23 a ton has been offered and paid around Dayton, Washington and vicinity. Practically no brewing barley is coming in this direction owing to the low price in effect locally.






