Washington, D. C., Jan. 30.—The Director of the Census has furnished the Oregon state legislature for its use in redistricting the state, a statement showing the population of Oregon by counties. The figures therein given are the result of an unverified count, of the returns of the thirteenth census, and are, therefore, subject to some possible revision, but it is hardly probable that such revision would materially affect the figures as given.

A game commission, to have general charge over game law regulations.

A commission to revise the judicial system of the state.

A text book commission to settle on books furnished under the free school book law.

Besides these, there are bills for the creation of several new state offices, including bills for an assistant secretary of state, state hotel inspector, a fire marshal and a state auditor or examiner of accounts. Another new office is proposed by an amendment to the constitution creating the position of lieutenant governor. A resolution submitting the last named proposal to the people has already been adopted by both houses.

### 13 STATE BOARD MEASURES PENDING

No less than 13 new state commissions and boards are proposed in bills now pending before the legislature at Salem. Several of these are to be without salary, if established, and others consist of present state officers invested with new duties or extended authority.

For instance, the public service commission, one of the most important, merely extends the jurisdiction of the state railway commission. Another example is the proposed state purchasing board, which would center in the present state board the purchase of supplies for all departments and institutions.

A civil service commission to formulate rules for examination of all employees of the state government is another made up of present state officers, and one of the same character is the board proposed for examination and approval of voting machines, should the bill to authorize use of such machines in Multnomah county become a law.

Other state commissions and boards named in pending bills are the following:

- Highway board, part of the Good Roads association plan.
- Naval militia board, under the bill organizing the naval reserve.
- A parole board, to pass on all applications for parole on indeterminate sentences.
- A state printing board, to take charge of printing under the flat salary plan.
- A board for the examination and registry of graduate nurses.
- A state board of accountancy, to

### ASTORIA BILL IS TANGLED.

**\$100,000 Appropriation in Danger of Defeat.**

State Capitol, Salem, Or., Jan. 30.—Through a strange combination of circumstances Senator Lester's bill, providing for an appropriation of \$100,000 for Astoria, is in a peculiar position and will need considerable tinkering before it is in a presentable shape and carries out the wishes of its author.

The bill originally asked \$100,000 for the Astoria Centennial Celebration. It went into the ways and means committee and was reported back as providing for \$25,000 under the condition that Astoria raise \$25,000 additional and Clatsop county raise another \$25,000. When the bill came back from the committee a storm of protest was raised by the senators, many of them favoring the original appropriation of \$100,000. Consequently it was referred back to the committee with instructions to change \$25,000 to \$100,000.

The committee made the change and reported back the bill without recommendation. Now it is discovered that Astoria must raise \$100,000 and Clatsop county another \$100,000 if the state appropriates the \$100,000. Doubt is expressed by a number of the senators as to the chances of the bill when it is finally properly amended and put on passage.

### HUMAN HAIR PRICES TAKING BIG SLUMP

Dealers in human hair are expecting another slump in prices next week due to the report from China to the effect that Mr. Wu Ting-fang expects to visit a barber on Monday next and have his queue lopped off. Mr. Wu's queue alone, of course, would hardly affect the hair market, but thousands of Chinese are likely to follow his example. Hundreds of metropolitan Orientals, it is announced, will visit the barber day after tomorrow and sacrifice their superfluous appendages as an offering to the spirit of progress that is rapidly becoming the chief loss of the Chinese.
