Washington.-A first aid to busy gislators is proposed by a bill intro-(Repn. Wis.) one of the simon-pure progressives who has some original ideas on the duties of statesmanship Nelson believes that the average member of the house is a rather questionable authority on matters of statute law, and to prove his point, he points to a score of "mandatory" statutes on the much abused law books that are absolutely nullified. In order to make sure that when a member of congress draws up a bill, it will be "iron-bound," without a flaw and without the much disputed "joker" that looms up large in the mind of the legislator whenever a new law is being framed, Nelson proposes to take the onerous duty of framing legislation out of the hands of the busy
