## HERBERT MYRICK COMING WEST

CALLED THE "JAMES J. HILL OF AMERICAN AGRICULTURE"

Famous Author and Publisher Will Speak in Vancouver at Coming Development Convention.

Portland, Ore.—Herbert Myrick, widely known as publisher, author, authority on American history, head of the Orange Judd publications and intimate of Roosevelt, will be the big attraction at the coming convention of the Southwest Washington Development association at Vancouver, delivering an address on February 15.

Mr. Myrick has been characterized as the "James J. Hill of American agriculture. He is an organizer and educator. Pre-eminently a self-made man, he is now the president of the Phelps Publishing company, of Springfield, Mass., with between \$2,000,000 and \$3,000,000 employed in his publishing industry. His printing plant, said to be the largest of its kind, occupies a vast fire-proof building with nearly nine acres of floor space.

Mr. Myrick will tell the convention his ideas on bringing people from the East to the ideal agricultural lands of the Northwest. He plans to keep the American farmer on this side of the Canadian border, and is deeply interested in building up the great Northwest states. He has been acquainted with the Northwest for the past 30 years and, having watched its

tremendous growth, is an optimist as to its future.

"I have ultimate faith in the great American Northwest," said Mr. Myrick in a recent interview, "and I back my faith not only with my works but with the money of my friends and myself. I believe if every individual, each association, commercial club, agricultural organization and other association throughout the Northwest would join a grand forward movement for developing the resources of this section and for advertising its advantages to the world, the results would be amazing.

"The hour has come for the Northwest to realize the community of interest which binds together the states from the lakes to the coast, including the empire states of Minnesota, the Dakotas, Wyoming, Montana, Idaho, Oregon and Washington. With united effort this region will show, during the next few years, phenomenal growth in population and earning power, in wealth and in all the things that make life worth living. To promote such an organization in the Northwest I tender the resources of the publications I have the honor to represent and of their periodicals with more than 10,000,000 readers."

In his coming tour of the Northwest Mr. Myrick will deliver a large number of addresses. He will appear before the legislatures at St. Paul, Bismarck and Pierre and very likely at Boise, Helena, Olympia and Salem. He will also speak at Seattle and Spokane and while in Portland will be the guest of the Portland Commercial club. If he has the time at his disposal he may make addresses in several Oregon cities.

Mr. Myrick is a prolific author, having written voluminously upon agricultural subjects besides turning out educational work, historical romances and editing many publications. "Who's Who in America," devotes considerable space to Mr. Myrick as the head, or founder, or numerous agricultural organizations and as editor, he occupies a pre-eminent place in American agriculture. He believes the Northwest will become

the leader of America in the coming century. One of his amusements is the collection of original data on the pioneer days and he is an authority on these matters.

Mr. Myrick will visit Seattle February 15, Olympia the following day, Vancouver on the 15th and Portland February 16.

### NELSON WOULD AID BUSY LAW MAKERS

Washington.—A first aid to busy legislators is proposed by a bill introduced in the House by Rep. Nelson (Repn. Wis.) one of the simon-pure progressives who has some original ideas on the duties of statesmanship. Nelson believes that the average member of the house is a rather questionable authority on matters of statute law, and to prove his point, he points to a score of "mandatory" statutes on the much abused law books that are absolutely nullified. In order to make sure that when a member of congress draws up a bill, it will be "iron-bound," without a flaw and without the much disputed "joker" that looms up large in the mind of the legislator whenever a new law is being framed, Nelson proposes to take the onerous duty of framing legislation out of the hands of the busy legislators.

Hurried legislation, framed on the floor of the house or the senate has invariably proven weak and ineffectual, Nelson says. So he proposes to establish a "legislative division of the congressional library," which shall draw up in the cool, quiet confines of the big building opposite the capitol, all the legislation to be proposed in congress. Nelson believes that bills carefully drawn up in the deeply studious atmosphere of the library by experts on the questions the law are to cover, will prove far superior to laws framed under the present system. Nelson's bill provides for a chief of

the legislative division at a salary to be fixed by the superintendent of the library, and authorizes the chief to employ experts technical assistants, investigators, and draftsmen as their services may be necessary.

The sum of \$150,000 annually is appropriated by the Nelson bill.
