### AGENTS BRINGING OUT NEW SETTLERS

#### PARTY LEAVING IOWA CITY TODAY FOR WEST

Hermiston Will Profit by Work of A. C. Crawford and Edgar Loudenschlager—Umatilla Project Homesteaders Supply Portland Market With Rabbits.

(Special Correspondence.)

Hermiston, Ore., Feb. 6.—Word has been received from Edgar S. Loudenschlager and A. C. Crawford, the representatives of the Maxwell Land & Irrigation company, that they will leave Davenport, Iowa, Tuesday with a party of people for Hermiston, Ore. On the evening of February 1 a banquet was held at the Davenport hotel, this was given by Messrs. Crawford and Loudenschlager to their respective buyers. Dr. E. S. Bowman acted as toastmaster. The table decorations were Oregon apples of the finest variety.

Some of the homesteaders of the Umatilla project have found a good way to get rid of the rabbits and also make some money at the same time. For the last two months these homesteaders have been killing rabbits and shipping them to Portland, receiving for same 25 cents apiece. Several large shipments have been made.

Word has been received from W. H. Skinner, who is at Washington, D. C. in the interests of the desert holders, that he has seen all of the reclamation attorneys and senators and that they are all heartily in favor of the mentment of the laws which will give patent to these claims without having to pay the water right in full. Mr. Skinner will stay in Washington for two weeks.

### SNITZ EDWARDS AS KING IN MUSICAL PLAY

Snitz Edwards, the short comedian, is playing the role of the ex-king Sergius in Samuel B. Row's sensational musical triumph, "The Queen of the Moulin Rouge," which has been the talk of the American stage for the past two years. The part, owing to the plot of the piece, is a Protean one, requiring his appearance in six distinct characters. Edwards plays each one "straight," and the heroic proportions of some of the roles introduce an element of the ridiculous, which is irresistible when played by a man under five feet high. This is the first season "The Queen of the Moulin Rouge" has played outside the big eastern cities. It comes to the Oregon on Monday, February 13, with practically the original cast and the same massive production, requiring three baggage cars for transportation. The presenting company is one of the largest musical organizations ever seen here, and is said to include a stunning chorus and ballet.

### REPORT IS MADE ON WEST UMATILLA PROJECT

Washington, D. C., Feb. 8.—A report from the project engineer on the Umatilla project in Oregon states that surveys have now been started on the reservoir site and the irrigable lands in the proposed West Extension of this project. A camp has been set up at the site of the proposed dam and test pits are being dug. Every effort is being made to push forward as rapidly as possible the necessary preliminary work of investigation. During the month of January about 5,000 cubic yards of material were excavated for laterals in the proposed fourth unit and additional work was done in deepening the drainage canals. The operation of the feed canal continued during the month and carried a maximum of 224 cubic feet per second. The available storage in the reservoir at the present time is 29,300 acre feet.

### MEXICAN AMBASSADOR WILL BE CHANGED

Washington, D. C., Feb. 7.—Henry Lane Wilson of Seattle, American ambassador to Mexico, is reported to contemplate retiring. It is said Newell Sanders of Chattanooga, Tenn., is to succeed him.

### J. PIERPONT MORGAN IS AT MONTE CARLO

Nice, France, Feb. 7.—J. Pierpont Morgan, apparently in the best of health, arrived here today. He landed at the Ville France and left immediately for Monte Carlo, where he will remain for several days.

### Japs to Play Ball

Tokio, Feb. 8.—A series of elimination games between the baseball teams of leading Japanese universities was commenced today, with the view of selecting a picked nine to invade the United States. Most of the players will be selected from the lines of Waseda and Keio universities, which were defeated by the university of Chicago club on its recent visit to Japan.

The Japanese players will leave here in March or early April, and will make a tour of the United States, occupying about six months, playing in San Francisco, St. Louis, Chicago, Boston, New York and other cities.
