ROOSEVELT DAM NEAR COMPLETION

TEDDY AND FAMILY WILL HELP CELEBRATE

Construction Watched by Engineers of World-More Than 1000 Feet Across the Top.

The last stone has been laid in the face. and preparations are now under way for its formal opening on March 18. Ex-President Roosevelt, for whom tion service. the massive structure has been named, accompanied by Mrs. Roosevelt, Archie and Ethel, will participate in the three-day celebration.

Located in an almost inaccessible canyon, sixty mlles from a railroad, the rapid and successful construction of the dam has been watched with interest by engineers all over the world. The massive walls rise two hundred and eighty-four feet from foundation to parapet. eighty feet and across it runs a road-way twenty feet in width.

will be used for the irrigation of more than two hundred thousand acres of land in the vicinity of Phoenix, Arizona, and the power created at the dam will be transmitted etectrically for more than a hundred miles down the valley to operate pumps. These pumps will raise maderground water to suplement the surface supply and increase the irrireclamation service that about sixty thousand acres will be irrigated by subterranean waters, available for irrigation purposes only through the operation of such pumps,

The building of the dam was preceded by the construction of a wagon road one hundred miles long. which, for practically half its length was blasted from the precipitous walls of the canyon. The construction of the road in itself is considered a marvelous feat of engineering and was a stupendous task. The laborers who built the road were mostly Apache
