



Second Legislative Committee Calls Upon Commissioner to Quit or Change Methods,


Salem, Ore., Feb. 18 .- That the best interests of the state of Oregon de-mand that J. W. Balley resign is the unanimous opinion of the second board of inquiry named by both branches of the twenty-sixth legislative assembly to investigate the conduct of the office of the dairy and food commissioner. Two reports were submitted to the legislature by the committee yesterday afternoon the majority report demanding his resignation or an immediate change from the past methods of conducting the department.


