CHICKENS SELLING AT A HIGH RECORD

ORDINARY FOWLS BRING 20 CENTS-FANCY ARE MORE

Egg Market Also Steady-Cornfed Beef Arrives From Nebraska-Shortage in Barley Supply.

(Friday's Journal.)

Chicken market has reached an entirely new high mark today. Sales of 20c, while those that had straight coops of selected hens were able to

squeeze a fraction more than this. Receipts of chickens continue rather limited, while for some reason or other the consumptive call is much better than usual. While the big retailers are making every effort to beat down the price by handling eastern storage goods they are not able to do it so easily as a few seasons ago, house stock.

The lack of demand for turkeys is surprise to the trade and live hens cates two things—the extraordinary call for chickens and the lack of denand for turkeys.

Eggs Are Steady Eggs are Steady along Front street ng quoted generally at 21c a dozen, although a few sales continue to be made at 20c.

The recent advance in the east and the fact that stocks here were not nearly so heavy as the trade had believed has led to the stiffening of prices.

It seemed that the trade here was far more scared than hurt by the eastern importations, and therefore as soon as it recovered from the fright the market assumed its normal

While in some quarters it is asserted that there is less demand for eggs since the price of smelt went so low, still the trade in general is inclined to the view that since the retail price was forced down to \$25c the wholesale demand was better,

The price of eggs today is still above the basis of a year ago. At that time there was a severe decline which caused the market to reach the bottom at 17c and 17 1-2c a dozen, but so heavy was the demand that the price instantly advanced and soon went to 22 and 23c again,

Corn-fed Beef, The first carload of beef cattle that ever came to this market from Nebraska arrived in from Wood River this morning. The shipment was to the Benson Commission company, and the sale made to the Union Meat

The carlot was brought through simply as an experiment and consisted of 21 head of steers that averaged here about 1225 pounds. The shrinkage from the east was unusually great and this is said to be the only bar agains greater importations,

The Nebraska cattle were corn fed and well finished and are said to be of extremely good quality. While the exact cost of bringing the chipment through is not known, purchasers believe it will be \$7, or perhaps a fraction more. The shipment will be held and fed for several days and then killed.

According to those who brought forward the shipment from Wood River the arrivals are somewhat in the nature of an experiment, and will be used to show local interests what real fancy fed cattle are.

Only One Load Hogs Available. While only one load of hogs was offering in the entire livestock market at North Portland today, this brought \$8.75, or the full prices of last week. The decline of yesterday is therefore fully recovered.

The rest of the arrivals in the hog market were contracted in Nebraska by a local packing company and therefore did not enter the trade at

While no sheep arrived today, some that came forward yesterday were disposed of. Lambs sold up to \$5.60 or about 15c less than previous shipments of like quality,

Henline & Ohlinger brought forard eight cars of hogs from Nebrasca as well as a load of cattle. Ball & Anderson had a load of hous

in the market from Hansen, Idaho. It was sold to a northern packer. Interior interests are buying back some of the barley they sold to the coast early in the season and are paying a good premium in order to get A sale of a big lot was made at Walla Walla recently by a Portland house at \$23 a ton for feed barley or fully \$3 a ton better than was obtainable a few months ago. In fact barley is so scarce today at interior points that the same price is ruling there for feed as for brewing. This is an unusual occurrence.

The great shortage in barley offer ngs in the interior is sure to have some effect upon the trade here but it, is not likely that Portland or other tidewater points will be forced very high unless there is a change in California. If the interior shows too much of a shortage, or sufficient to stop shipments in this direction, it would cause importations again from the south,

While some buyers say they are still able to purchase No. 1 white oats at \$27 a ton, others are freely offering \$27.50 and are taking all they can get at that figure. This is an advance of about \$50c over what these same interests were offering a short time

Mill stuffs are somewhat firmer with a call from the south. Export flour trade is stagnant but sellers report that an improvement is cently renovated.
