

Harriman Lines Carry 49,491 000 Persons in Safety

BLOCK SYSTEM IS TELLING. Report for 1910 Received by Local Agents Show No Fatalities-17,960 Miles Covered-Anti-Accident Crusade Effective.

Installation of safety devices and the block signal system are cited for the record of the Harriman railroads in carrying 49,491,000 passengers in 1910 without sacrificing a single life The report was compiled in the office of Julius Kruttschnitt, director of maintenance and operation, Chiago. It covers the business of the Union Pacific, Southern Pacific and affiliated roads, a total of 17,960 miles. The total number of passengers carried on a mile basis is 3,000,

The Harriman system carried 10 per cent of the estimated 1910 passenger traffic. The figures for most of the other railroads have not yet een compiled by the government, but in 1909 the number of passengers caried was 29,000,000,000. The figures for 1910, it is said, will not exseed a billion more.

Many other railroads have gone through a year without a fatality to any of its passengers, but it is said that no system has made this record
