

LIVESTOCK MARKET TAKING A TUMBLE

HOGS, CATTLE AND SHEEP ALL ON THE TOBOGGAN

Porkers Drop Fifteen Cents, Beef Ten to Fifteen and Sheep the Same—Wool Quotations Are Nominal.

(Monday's Journal.) Late this afternoon the following changes were showing in the livestock market at North Portland:

Hogs—Down about 15c.
Cattle—Market .06 to 15c lower.
Sheep and Lambs—Price 10c to 15c lower.

Run of livestock in the North Portland yards over Sunday was one of the greatest ever shown here. A huge bunch of cattle came forward from Montana and Idaho as well as from Nebraska. The latter were purchased prior to arrival by a local packer and therefore did not enter the trade.

On account of the heavy run of best stock generally, lower prices ruled here today. Cattle were principally about a dime lower with the movement restricted during the early part of the day.

On account of the arrivals from the east, buyers were not bidding so high for hogs here and the same can be said of the sheep situation.

WOOL QUOTED NOMINAL

Small Lots Moving at 16c to 17c for Coarse to Medium; East Weak.

A few small lots of wool are reported sold in the local market. For coarse dealers are offering 16c and for medium 17c a pound. Trade with the east is limited on account of the tariff agitation.

Holding Butter Firm.

Decreasing make of local butter on account of the recent cool weather is holding the price of fresh goods very firm here, although there is plenty of eastern and storage butter on hand.

Egg Situation Easier.

There is a slight tone of easiness in the egg situation. A few days ago the San Francisco market struck 17c a dozen for the first time since the dairy exchange was established. This was the low point of the season and is said to be caused by the greater offerings and not to any change in the storage situation.

Locally the egg market is standing at 10 & 20c a dozen. While a few dealers are still trying to get 21c for supplies, their efforts are not very successful and most dealers are not asking over 20c and say they would be willing to clean up at 19c.

Pay More for Potatoes.

A slightly better feeling is apparent in the potato trade all along the coast. Whether this is due to the temporary check of arrivals or to a better undertone the next week will show. Buyers here are offering an advance of about 10 per cent.

Portland Wheat Low.

Lack of suitable steamship facilities with the orient and a general lack of competition for the business from this port is said by grain interests to be responsible for the low price on wheat here as compared with ports that have competition. It is stated that although Portland has been forced to pay \$3 a ton on flour for oriental shipment, northern millers have been able to ship for \$1 less. This means therefore, that they are able to pay fully 2c a bushel more for wheat and still sell at the margin of profit.

Locally there is a slightly better feeling in the wheat trade. Exporters have advanced their quotations a cent a bushel and millers generally are offering the same rise. This places crub at 78 @ 79c a bushel and bluestem 81 @ 82c. Both of these are for track delivery.

There was an improvement in the foreign wheat situation today and Liverpool was higher although Berlin and Antwerp were not so firm.

Oats market is firmer for large lots and for small ones and while some small deals have been closed at \$27 a ton for No. 1 white, those that want larger lots are forced to pay more. This is a reversal of the general rule.

Barley is about 50c a ton higher on account of a further improvement in the east. Feed is quoted here at \$23.50 @ \$24 a ton.

There is no change in the flour situation.

PROFITS FOR PRISONERS.

Rhode Island Cons Share Proceeds of Labor.

Providence, R. I., March 7.—There was something resembling joy depicted on the countenances of the 400 convicts in Rhode Island state prison when they went to their allotted tasks this morning, for from this time on they will share in the profits made on their work. James F. McCusker, the new warden of the Cranston institution, is responsible for the project put into effect today.

Under the plan, the project-sharing system is to apply to all prisoners employed in the workshops, kitchen, laundry, bakery, engineering department and such other departments as the chairman of the state board may direct. All receipts in excess of \$2000 a month are to be used for this purpose and no part of the money thus paid to prisoners is to be used for the payment of fines or costs of court. All convicts who have been employed three months or more are entitled to share in the fund.

"Our board believes that this plan will be conducive to good discipline and be of great benefit to the men," said Chairman Walter A. Read. "Many of the men leave the prison broken in spirits and with only a suit of clothes and \$5 between them and beggary. The new system will give the prisoner a chance to save money for a fresh start in the world or to help his family, if he has anyone dependent upon him."
