PRICES OFF--CATTLE TAKEN FROM MARKET

PRIME CALIFORNIA STEERS PLACED ON FEED AGAIN

Prineville Offerings Disposed of at a Sacrifice--Nebraska Hogs Enter Northwest Field -- Japan Secretly Buying Wheat.

(Friday's Journal.)

So great is the weakness now ruling in the cattle market at North Portland and so unsatisfactory are the quotations to shippers that one lot of eight loads was taken out of the yards and put on feed again.

This was the lot brought in from California by Kidwell & Caswell and is said to be one of the best to enter the yards recently. The entire shipment was withdrawn from market only when the shippers found it impossible to sell them at a price that would not net them an actual loss. The lot was taken to the Sun Dial ranch at Troutdale where the animals will be kept until the situation assumes normal proportions.

While one lot of steers that averaged 1100 pounds was sold this morning at \$6.19, others could not be moved above \$6. The big lot from Prineville has at last been sold with \$6 the extreme top for steers and one portion going at \$5.50. The lot that brought the higher figure averaged 1222 pounds, while the lot that went at \$5.50 averaged 1129 pounds. Another lot that brought the lower range averaged 1128 pounds.

Sellers expressed much disappointment at the prices received but sold the supplies rather than feed and hold them for a later market.

Nebraska Hogs Come Forward. That Pacific northwest packers are still determined to bring in all the packing hogs they need, from outside of this territory, is shown by the renewal of the heavy shipments from Nebraska. One local meat company brought forward 10 loads from there this morning; these forming practically all the arrivals in that line.


There were no arrivals in the sheep pens at North Portland today and therefore the price list is held intact at the advance quoted by the Journal yesterday.



tion on export here is \$3.60 less 2 per cent but no offers from Japan have been received above \$3.40. It is stated that some business at this figure has been accepted by some of the interior mills. This is stated to be about 10c below actual cost of production. Japan is still buying club and red wheat, and for that reason the market price here is holding firm at unchanged figures. It is now stated that the Japanese secretly secured an enormous supply of wheat by paying a small premium, while the general trade believed there was no actual business available.

Alfalfa hay is weaker again and quotations have been dropped. So great is the press of supplies at Idaho points that shippers there are consigning to this market. Several of them are said to have been caught in such deals by get-rich-quick men.

Fancy timothy hay is extremely scarce and the price is firm at \$20 to \$21 a ton. It is now stated that only about five carloads of strictly fancy timothy are available in this territory, although there is a flood of ordinary timothy available at \$14 to \$18 a ton according to quality.

EGGS ARE HOLDING. Sales Continue to Be Made Around 17c and 18c; Supply Is Limited.

At the low mark reached yesterday the egg market shows a fair movement. Sales are still being made from 17c to 18c, the former being the buying price and the latter the selling price.

Cheese continues firm for fresh offerings and weak for storage.
