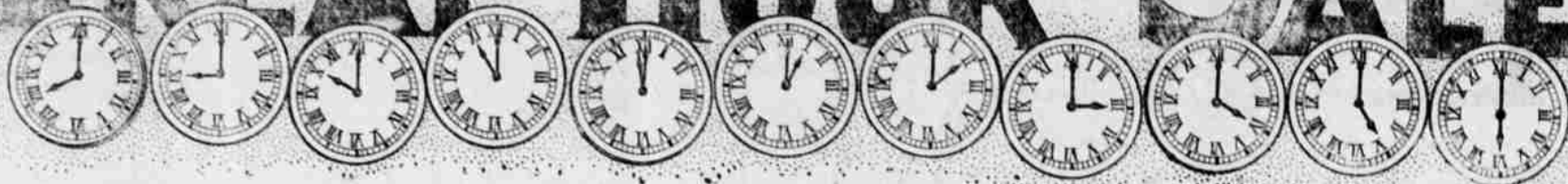

**NECKTIES IN ENGLAND.**  
Question of Importance Enough to Attract Attention of Consul.  
Fresh from the scene comes an official government report on the neck-tie situation in England. U. S. Consul Albert Halstead, stationed at Birmingham, has been looking into the matter and he says, as a result of his observations:  
"For the past half of a decade the broad-ended tie made from the piece has been the rage in England,

and haberdashers will not look at anything else. Its vogue is likely to continue for another year or two, particularly as it is to the interests of both the manufacturers and dealers to keep it going as long as possible. This type has a maximum length in England of 42 inches, the average for such four-in-hands being 36 to 38 inches.  
"A good grade of Irish-poplin tubular tie retails at about 50 cents; the highest quality Irish poplin, however, which comes in the piece, when

made up, retails at about 75 cents. Other styles are priced at 60, 45, and 35 cents, and the ties of these classes are to be found in men's furnishings stores of any of the larger British cities. Wholesalers pay about \$2.90 per dozen for ties that retail at 45 cents each, and sell them to the dealers at \$3.40 per dozen."  
New Parliamentarian.  
Washington, March 21.—Charles Crisp, son of former Speaker Crisp of the house of representatives, reported

in Washington today to prepare for his duties as parliamentarian or the sixty-second house and clerk and adviser to Speaker Champ Clark. Judge Crisp is considered one of the ablest parliamentarians of the country.  
POSTAL CLERKS FORM UNION.  
Postmaster General Hitchcock Does Not Look Upon Move With Favor.  
The present progress of organization undertaken by the American Federation of Labor for the unioniza-

tion of the entire railway postal service will necessitate the issuance of over fifty charters to the different chapters. The postoffice department, especially the postmaster general, does not look upon this movement of the railway clerks with favor.  
President Gompers of the American Federation of Labor, however, declares that he will take every postoffice clerk in the service under the protection of the labor federation and that it makes no difference what attitude the department will take. Sec-

retary Morrison of the American Federation of Labor, says that more than twenty-five charters have already been issued and that as many more will soon be granted.  
The federation makes no secret of the fact that it intends to give aid in every manner possible to the clerks. If necessary, and according to the opinion of the labor officials it may be they will call a strike. Such a strike, tying up the mails, would be one of the most disastrous ever known in this country, it is said.
