

FLORIDA MINES MOST PHOSPATE Other States Make Reduced Output in 1909.

The United States geological survey reports that the quantity and value of phosphate mined in Florida in 1909 were somewhat greater than in 1908, although South Carolina and Tennessee, the other producing states, made a reduced output. The figures for Florida are: 1908, \$8,484,539; 1909, \$8,541,301. The total value of phosphate mined in the United States in 1909 was \$10,772,120, as against \$11,-399,124 in 1908. The average price per ton was slightly lower in 1909. The United States geological survey has just published its report entitled 'Mineral resources of the United States, calendar year 1909," on "The "The production of phosphate rock in 1909," by F. B. Van Horn, which may be obtained free of charge by applying to the director of the survey at Washington, D. C.
