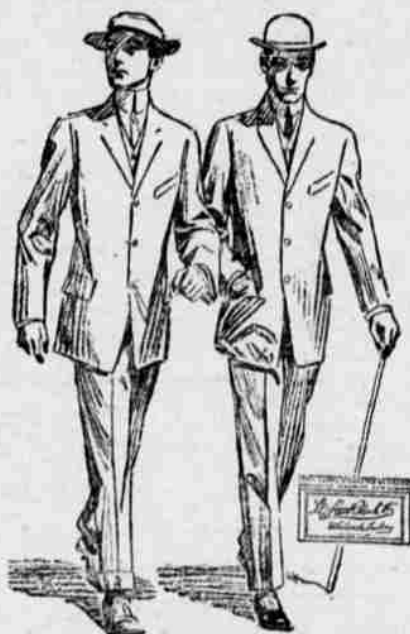

### TO WORK CONVICTS ON STATE ROADS

#### OVERCROWDING OF PRISON RESULTS IN FRESH AIR PLAN

#### Governor Calls Conference With State, County and City Officials—Three Will Co-operate.

Salem, Ore., March 25.—At a conference held in the governor's office Thursday night which was attended by members of the county court of Marion county, and the executive committee of the board of trade, plans were discussed for a complete and extensive system of macadamized roads connecting the city with the state institutions and the institutions with each other. Convict labor is to be utilized.

Gov. West called the conference with the idea that united effort can perhaps accomplish much toward bringing about the desired end. The roads leading to many of the institutions are in a bad shape. The state, county and city are all mutually interested and the governor believes the city and county should be willing to

co-operate with the state in the matter.

No extensive plan of boulevards is planned, but merely good, substantial serviceable roads that will be of use to everybody in the vicinity. They will also serve as a model and a nucleus around which the movement for good roads can gain strength for effort in other parts of the state.

The number of convicts at the penitentiary is growing rapidly. As the legislature did not make adequate provision for such an unexpected increase the problem of their retention is going to be a large one. If the county and city will provide the funds the governor thinks the state can legally provide the labor from the penitentiary. It will be a benefit both to the state and a God-send to the convicts to be allowed to labor in the open during the summer months.

Since January 1 the increase at the penitentiary has been from 412 to 480, that being the number confined there yesterday. Others are expected soon, so that the number will be increased nearly 100 within a few months. The highest number for the past few years has been 420. There is not adequate room for 480 convicts, the number now confined in the Oregon state penitentiary.
