"Although malters were anxious buyers yesterday, they expressed the opinion at the close that the advance was about enough for the time being, as they have secured fairly liberal supply by purchases made to arrive and even the most rampant bulls regarded the market as strained, though they continued to predict \$1.25 ster in the season,"
