Vancouver, Wash.—That the Mount Hood Railway & Power company will expend about \$25,000 in a substation and distribution system in Vancouver and vicinity within the next year was announced today by J. S. Groo, local representative of the corporation. A lot for the substation, just east of the garrison, on Fifth street road was bought today from William Katrulich for \$4000.

Power for this city will be transmitted through lines under the Columbia river, from Portland. It is expected that 500 horsepower will be furnished to Vancouver in less than one year.
