HOGS ARE NOMINAL CATTLE MARKET WEAK

SHEEP HOLDING STEADY YEARLING WETHERS \$5

Estimated That 3,500,000 Bushels of Wheat Remaining in the Northwest—Amount Considered Small and Market is Excited as a Result of Coarsity.

- In the Stockyards.
- North Portland—Hogs nominal; sheep steady; cattle weak.
- South Omaha—Hogs 5c higher; cattle steady; sheep weaker.
- Chicago—Hogs strong, 5c higher; cattle strong; sheep steady.

The fine bunch of Idaho steers was sold this afternoon at sacrifice quotations. The lot was taken by a local buyer at \$7.00 or fully 10c from what they would have been worth a few days ago. At that time inferior quality sold at \$7.05, while all interests agree that the latest offerings were worth fully \$5c more.

There were only two loads of live stock in the North Portland yards today with the exception of the staff that has been carried over from previous days on account of the lack of buyers.

The Idaho steers that were said even by the buyers to be the best that ever entered the Portland yards, not even barring short stock, have been held over several days because the feeders did not want to sell them at less money than it cost to produce the animals.

The market for sheep is holding steady and best yearling wethers are selling at \$5.

No hogs arrived but that line is generally considered weak. At South Omaha there was an advance of 5c in swine values for the day, and the landing price for Omaha hogs at Pacific northwest packing plants stands at \$7.10 or practically the same values that have been in effect here recently.

Wheat is scarce. That there are not more than 3,500,000 bushels of wheat remaining in the hands of all growers of the Pacific northwest was the assertion of one of the largest buyers of wheat this morning.

The same interest places the amount of wheat in the hands of millers and dealers at 1,500,000 bushels, making total holdings of the cereal in Oregon, Idaho and Washington 5,000,000 bushels.

This is the smallest amount of wheat estimated in the hands of local interests to date this season but the figures are now considered approximately correct by the trade in general.

Wheat market is excited as a result of the scarcity of stock and bids for club are being made as high as \$4@5c a bushel, basis track delivery, Portland. Bids for bluestem range from \$9@9.50c a bushel but it is now believed that No. 1 milling can be secured even in small lots under the higher figure.

Wheat is held in strong hands at this time and even the more bearish of the millers say they are not able to secure supplies except at higher prices.

As exclusively forecasted by The Journal a week ago, the price of patent flour was advanced 20c a barrel here today, following a similar movement of prices in the north.

Oats and barley markets are firm with no general change in the situation.

Millstuffs are firm and prices have been advanced 50c a ton from the low mark.

Poultry Market Lower. Still another cut of a cent a pound is showing in the local chicken market as the result of the increasing offerings and the filled up condition of the trade in general.

Quite a number of coops of chickens were carried over from yesterday and dealers report that they will be compelled to lower their quotations to 10c in order to clean up.

Not only is the chicken market depressed at the moment but the weakness is showing in other lines. While only a few dressed turkeys have come forward during the past 48 hours, receivers have not been able to move them. They are today asking 25@26c for good stock but buyers want supplies for less.

Only a few small shipments of geese and ducks are coming forward and trade in these lines is nominal.

Eastern poultry is generally considered the depressing feature of the trade here at present. Supplies of storage stock are brought forward and find a ready demand from the cheap eating houses.

and parcels of land should pay on account of the benefits to be derived from such proposed improvement, and the City Surveyor shall file such plans and specifications and estimates in the office of the Recorder of The City of Pendleton. If the Council shall find such plans, specifications and estimates to be satisfactory, it shall approve the same and shall determine the boundaries of the district benefited and to be assessed for such improvement and the action of the Council in the creation of such an assessment district shall be final and conclusive. The Council shall by resolution declare its purpose of making such improvement, describing the same and including such engineer's estimates of the probable total cost thereof, and also defining the boundaries of the assessment district to be benefited and assessed therefor. The action of the Council in declaring its intention to improve any street or streets or any part or parts thereof, directing the publication of notice thereof, approving and adopting the plans and specifications and estimates of the City Surveyor, and determining the district benefited and to be assessed therefor, may all be done in one and the same act.

(3) The resolution of the Council declaring its purpose to improve the street shall be published for a period shall also be published therewith a notice that the Surveyor's estimate of the proportion of the cost of said work to be charged against each lot, part of lot and parcel of land is on file in the office of the City Recorder, and a copy of such resolution, together with the report of the Surveyor showing the probable percentage of benefit to be assessed against each lot, part of lot and parcel of land within such district, shall be kept of record in the office of the City Recorder.

(4) Within ten days from the date of the first publication of the notice required to be published in the preceding section the owners of 80 per cent or more in area of the property within such assessment district may make and file with the City Recorder a written objection or remonstrance against such proposed improvement, and such objection or remonstrance shall be a bar to any further proceeding in the making of such improvement for a period of six months, unless the owners of one-half or more of the property affected as aforesaid shall subsequently petition therefor.

(5) If no such objection or remonstrance be made or filed with the Recorder within the time designated, the Council shall be deemed to have acquired jurisdiction to order the improvements to be made, and the Council may thereafter by ordinance provide for making such improvement, which shall conform in all particulars to the plans and specifications previously adopted.

(6) Where the improvement of any street is ordered by the Recorder, upon instruction from the Common Council, shall immediately invite proposals for making the same, in accordance with ordinance provided, which proposals shall be opened in the presence of a majority of the Common Council and the contract awarded to the lowest responsible bidder for either the whole of said improvement or such part thereof as will not materially conflict with the completion of the remainder thereof. The Common Council shall have the right to reject any or all proposals received. If all proposals shall be rejected the Common Council shall have power by resolution duly adopted, or any portion thereof, may be made under the direction of the Common Council by purchasing the materials and hiring the labor therefor. The Common Council shall have the power to provide for the proper inspection and supervision of all work done under the provisions of this article, and to do any other act to secure the faithful carrying out and the completion of all improvements in strict compliance with the ordinances and specifications therefor, and shall have power to direct that the cost of said improvements, or any portion thereof, shall be paid for by the City.

(7) Upon the signing of the contract, or upon the determination of improvement under its own supervision by purchasing the material and the Common Council to make said of ten days in some newspaper to be designated by the Council, and there hiring the labor therefor, or as soon thereafter as is reasonably convenient, the Common Council shall proceed to apportion and assess the cost of making such improvement upon the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land within the assessment district, in accordance with the special and particular benefits derived by each lot, part of lot and parcel of land. No notice of such hearing and assessment shall be necessary other than

the notice required by subdivision 3 of this section, and all objections or exceptions to the Surveyor's estimates of percentage or any application for raising or lowering the same in any particular shall be filed with the City Recorder within fifteen days after the first publication of such notice, and at such hearing the Common Council shall consider the said City Surveyor's estimates of assessments and all objections thereto, and shall have the power at its discretion, and without any further notice, to consider, ascertain and determine the amount of the special and peculiar benefits accruing to each lot, part of lot or parcel of land within said assessment district by reason of such improvement, and the amount apportioned by the City Surveyor to any lot, part of lot or parcel of land shall be so reduced or increased by the Common Council that it shall be in just proportion to such benefits. But in no case shall any such percentage exceed such benefit. The amount of such assessment against each lot, part of lot and parcel of land shall be declared by ordinance, and the Recorder shall thereupon enter the same in the lien docket of The City of Pendleton, and the same shall thereafter be known as the Recorder's Estimate and Assessment. The contract price, based upon the estimate of the City Surveyor, or if there be no contract, the estimates of the City Surveyor, the cost of right of way and expenses of condemning the land and a sum not exceeding five per cent of the contract price, or the surveyor's estimate as the cost of advertising, engineering and superintendence shall be deemed to be the cost of every improvement.
