(Special Correspondence.) Stanfield, Ore., April 27.—C. P. Bowman was in from Butter creek yesterday and reports that considerable progress has been made toward the organization of the independent telephone company in which he is taking an active interest. There will be a meeting at Hermiston Saturday, May 13th, for the purpose of completing the organization.

D., has just completed a very convenient and attractive residence on his ten acre tract four miles from Stanfield and will move into it this week. Mr. Connelly is improving his place, having already planted several acres of fruit trees and strawberries.

Work was commenced this morning on the graveling of Main street for two blocks north to Taft avenue and Coe avenue west two blocks from Main street. This is an improvement that will be greatly appreciated. G. W. Lilly of Portland, recently sold to S. Oldenberg of Barlow, Ore., his 48 acre tract, partly improved, which is situated in section 33 close to town. Mr. Oldenberg will finish the improvement, planting the entire tract to orchard.

R. M. Tuttle, who owns 50 acres under the Furnish ditch, was up from Portland this week looking after his interests here. His land has all been improved, most of it being planted to orchard. Mr. Sage who arrived from Portland recently, has been looking over this section of the country and expresses the opinion that this portion of Umatilla county is destined to become famous as a fruit country. The Pennsylvania State Highway department has issued more than 25,000 licenses for 1911. This is the largest number ever issued up to this period of the year, and is 3000 ahead of last year. Over 9000 chauffeurs have been licensed.

The British expedition, under the command of Captain Scott, which is pushing on to the south pole, is equipped with three motor sledges, designed after exhaustive tests made on the snows of Norway. These sledges have been nick-named "Catterpillars," and get over the ground by means of an endless chain arrangement.

According to latest estimates 32,000 cars, with \$60,000,000 worth of automobiles are now sold in New York City each year. There are seventy different agencies, employing about 700 men. The average pay of salesmen is \$2000 a year, though the best make \$10,000.

The approximate distance to be covered by this year's Glidden Tour is 1,000 miles. The start will be made June 19 from Washington, and the tour will end at Ottawa, Can., June 26. Ellensburg, Wash.—The body of John O'Brien, who was drowned in the west work of the Teanaway river on March 24, was found lodged on the beach of an island in the Yakima river, opposite Tjossem's by a party of log drivers.

The body had floated 60 miles before lodging and on its trip through the river every vestige of clothing, except shoes and a fragment of a shirt, had been torn from it. Although badly decomposed, it was recognized by the loggers, and, after being inspected by Sheriff German and Coroner Wasson was removed to the undertakers in Ellensburg.

STREETS MARKED IN WALKS.

Walla Walla Adopts Plan of Designating Thoroughfares. Walla Walla, Wash.—With the building of new walks, throughout

the city, all of which are to be concrete, a plan of marking the streets has been adopted that will prove useful to Walla Wallans as well as strangers, in finding their way about the city. The names of the streets are being marked in the walks, at the corners, before the concrete hardens and when the walk is completed, the name of the street is written so that it may be easily read.
