PROJECT WILL BE GREAT FRUIT SECTION

MANY COMPANIES ARE HOLDING WATER RIGHTS All Are Incorporated With Principal Offices at Hermiston — Change Made in Payments of Water Rights on Land.

(Special Correspondence.) Hermiston, Ore., May 16.—That the Umatilla government project will be a fruit section is shown by the number of fruit companies that have been formed and are holding water right under this project. These companies are incorporated under the state law of Oregon, with the principal office at Hermiston, each company having a general manager located at the project. The stock that is issued by these companies is assessable. Most of these companies are now clearing their lands, some putting in onions, etc., but all are putting in fruit trees and getting their land in shape.

There are also several more companies formed, but have not as yet made their application for water. The above companies are composed of people from Erie, Pa., and Ft. Wayne, Indiana. All have brought their people out here, implements, wagons, etc.

Change in Water Payments. A letter has been received by the secretary of the Umatilla River Water Users' association, which will make quite a change in the payments of the water rights on this project. It has been the custom by the receiver at La Grande to make the water right charge in accordance with the acreage hereafter, however, any person who holds a fraction of an acre must pay the full charge for one acre of land.

ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER. Washington, D. C. Therefore, any person holding a fraction of an acre on this project will have to pay for a full acre of land, being \$6 per acre and \$1.30 maintenance and operation charges.
