Change in Water Payments. letter has been received by the eretary of the Umatilla River Waer Users' association, which will take quite a change in the payments the water rights on this project. has been the custom by the receivr at La Grande to make the water ight charge in accordance with the creage hereafter, however, any per on who holds a fraction of an acre must pay the full charge for one cre of land. The letter reads as ollows:

Sir: In reply to your letter of April 10th, 1911, you are advised that in accordance with the practice of this epartment and the circular of instructions of March 18, 1911, you hould collect water right charges for one whole acre in all cases where water right certificate is issued covering a lesser area. Where a fractional part of an acre is included in a water right application together with other lands, you may properly collect charges on the fractional acreage. But where the total wcreage is less than one acre you should collect charges as for a full acre. vater right account card recently furnished you in connection will show what charges are to be made.

Very respectfully, ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER.




