MENACE SEEN IN BEAN.
 Attempted Introduction of Medical Berry Gets Red Man Into Trouble.

TO NAVIGATE SALMON RIVER
 Deer Creek Miners Determine to Try Experiment.
 Astoria, Wash.—Owners of mines in the vicinity of Deer Creek, on Salmon river, a short distance from the mouth who have developed a number of high grade properties, realizing that even though construction work on the Gilmore & Pittsburg railway should begin this summer, it will be at least two years before they will have transportation for the output of their mines, have entered into negotiations with Glover & McFarland, owners of the gasoline launch Flyer, to put the boat in commission between Deer Creek and Lewiston, and the initial trip will be made about June 6. The launch is now on the way here, being equipped with a 60-horsepower engine, and it is believed that enough power can be developed for the packet to successfully negotiate the rapids in the Snake river as far as Pittsburg Landing, about 65 miles above Astoria. If this can be accomplished there is no doubt but navigation can be accomplished several miles up the Salmon.
 If the Flyer succeeds in going up Salmon river it will be the first power boat ever to enter the stream, and a new era will be inaugurated for the Helix miners. Helix, where there are a number of promising claims lying dormant because of the inability of the owners to get machinery in and the ore out.
 On the initial run the boat will be in command of an experienced pilot, and an expert gasoline engine man from the factory which supplied the motor will have charge of the engines. Besides the owners the party will include several newspaper men. Invitations having been extended to the representatives of The Spokesman Review and Lewiston papers to accompany the expedition. It is anticipated that the round trip can be made in three days.
