HERMISTON FARMERS CUTTING ALFALFA

CROP ESTIMATED AT TWO TONS PER ACRE

(Special Correspondence.) Hermiston, Ore., June 10.—The first crop of alfalfa is now being cut by the people on this project and on every side can be seen the machinery at work.

The first cutting is estimated to be about two tons per acre, but the second cutting will be the heaviest of the season.

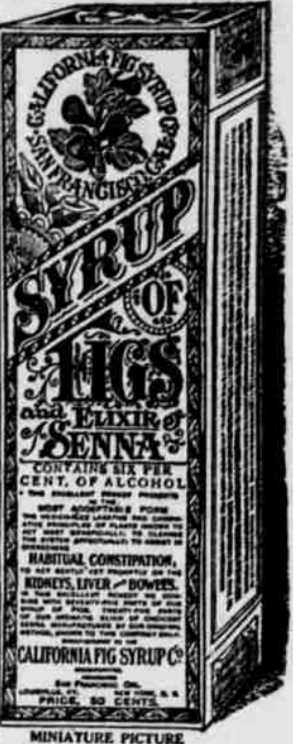
