HERMISTON FARMERS **CUTTING ALFALFA**

CROP ESTIMATED AT TWO TONS PER ACRE

Royal College of Porpora Will Start a Branch College at the Project Town-Waterusers Secure SCounsel to Fight Water Question,

(Special Correspondence.) Hermiston, Ore., June 10 .- The first crop of alfalfa is now being cut by the people on this project and on every side can be seen the machinery at work. Every farmer now is very busy working on his lands. Some started cutting last week but the cutting did not become general until

The first cutting is estimated to be about two tons per acre, but the second cutting will be the heaviest of the

On the original project there are over 800 acres in alfalfa and there is over that outside of the original project. This would mean over 3000 tons for the first cutting of alfalfa. Very little hay has been shipped up to date, the Newport company being the only one to ship any hay out of the project. The farmers are buying their own cows and are of the idea that it is better not to ship their hay outside the project.
